

EDP Goals

- Support the development of the India Basin
 Waterfront Parks designed in partnership
 with the Bayview-Hunters Point community
- <u>Prevent further displacement</u> of the Black community living and working in Bayview-Hunters Point
- Acknowledge and correct <u>historic and</u> <u>systemic environmental injustices</u> within Bayview-Hunters Point
- Provide <u>sustained resources</u> that support and guide ongoing community organizing, capacity-building, and decision-making efforts within the area
- Leverage the <u>Park as a catalyst</u> for environmental remediation and regeneration




Budget and Fundraising Update
